A Week in Chiapas

In July, we spent a week back in Chiapas. The 15 students of Chiapas Bible Institute joined us to study the Word with the great interest. Cristina Gomez was amazing a mother-student who studied with her little boy. She was a bit shy speaking in Spanish (its her second language), but her love to the Word made her to overcome such obstacles. Francisco Pañate was an outstanding student. He once was a member of Zapatista guerilla movement in Chiapas but now he wants to learn to fight for Christ's sake.

Early August 2006, 500+ children were challenged as they learned about the global urgent need of hearing the gospel. At Centro Cristiano de Cuernavaca (Christian center of Cuernavaca – a Pentecostal church with 3000+ members) hosted these children from all evangelical churches in town, of course including Presbyterian churches. It was "Mission Adventure for Children" to awake them up to the heart of God Father for His lost world. Ministry Alliance of Morelos State, known as AMEM organized it to motivate churches in general to get involved in world missions. Adults, at the same time, were gathered in another church for a mission conference. We, along with WEC missionaries, served children by sharing the spiritual need in North Korea.

One Sept. morning we woke up at 4:30 a.m. for a mission trip to Taxco El Viejo community. Medical Drs. Antonio Moreno & Silvia Sanchez (couple) led us. There were 300+ patients (mostly non Christians) waiting for us to bring the priceless service. All service was free of charge plus Soul Clinic ministry. Five dentists faithfully attended them literally 10 hours with very few breaks. Regardless of our sweat, we enjoyed with tears hugging people seeing them to come to Christ through the 2-day service. The most precious gift was shared in the community.

Amigos Sin Frontera (Friends without Frontier) is a local based medical non-profit group. They are scheduled for Chiapas later this year and Durango early 2007. Please pray for this ministry. It is totally Mexican ministry and faith ministry. It runs upon donations.
